### Letter from the President

Dear Member of Honesdale Golf Club.



We improving! are Honesdale Golf Club has and will continue to go through major challenges, adjustments, changes; with our membership, infrastructure, finances, future endeavors, rising inflation and increased costs. However, it is with "all of us" that we can and will continue to have Honesdale Golf Club rise and concur.

Last year, we learned how far our club can stretch our memberships financially by hurdling a drought that affected our course, and many more obstacles. We were blessed to receive unanimous support from our HGC stockholders (bonded members) to trust the board of directors to raise dues to fight inflation, charge assessments for much needed repairs throughout the club, both on and off the course. Because of this huge support, it quite honestly saved our club.

We are not out of the woods yet. Just like our personal lives, golf courses have seen rising costs of upwards to 40% involving the golf course, restaurant, and bar. With continued support and diligence of budgeting properly, and living within our means; we can do this!

I am happy to say that this year we are able to keep our amazing team, as well welcome new staff members. Daily operations through the season carry a lot of work and we are very appreciative of our hardworking staff.

All of this leads the board of directors to take a long and hard look at everything we do as a club at HGC. It made us realize the club cannot continue to be a bank for members that fail to pay invoices and dues on time. This is the reason the board of directors, through your trust, authorized requirements for members to keep credit cards, or checking accounts on file to keep due invoices being paid on time and keep a stable treasury. You may still pay your invoices within a 28 day window with a check, or by cash.

In a positive response, we have found that a majority of our members have really stepped up and paid their dues in full for the coming year. This is helping our treasury to grow and become sustainable as we enter our golf season.

Our physical achievements during 2022 included a much needed ceiling replacement in the club house, a remodeled pro shop, new golf carts, and new golf course maintenance equipment. Also, through an assessment, we were able to replace one of our two (30 year old) furnaces and air conditioning units for the bar and the west side of the club house.

We know that our future holds the need to replace a lot of aging equipment and infrastructure. We will continue to monitor our golf course equipment needs, a golf cart replacement strategy, and future large purchases through our long-term planning. Items that we have on our radar at this

time include: kitchen dishwasher, aging clubhouse furnace and air conditioning unit (east side of building), fairway and greens machinery, sprayer, water and irrigation needs, and the aging locker rooms and plumbing inside the club house.

All of this can be and will be accomplished through our support of each other and financial responsibilities of all of us taking part in owning this great golf club!

This past year we were also grateful to all of our membership committees that came together for the betterment of the club to add additional golf and social activities for members. Members of the committees worked very hard behind the scenes to make these events happen for all of us to enjoy.

As we commence into the new year, we are in the process of planning a wide range of exciting and enjoyable golf and social activities for the 2023 season. Future golfing events scheduled so far are Men's Opening Stag on Saturday, April 29, 2023; Ladies' Opening Dinner on May 2, 2023; Men's Member Guest on June 16-18, 2023; Ladies Member Guest on June 20, 2023, an all inclusive Men and Ladies' Memorial Tournament and Club Championship Tournament September 2-4, 2023, with a club house membership celebration and barb-a-que prepared by your president. We can do this! Together.





## Memberships Explained

**Full Membership** (Bonded Member) As a full voting member and shareholder, with your Golf Membership you will enjoy all of Honesdale Golf Club amenities including unlimited championship golf without green fees on our private course, practice facilities, clubhouse, dining and a full year-round social calendar with events and activities for the entire family as well as business associates and friends. Membership includes voting rights and stock options. These members own a share of stock and are eligible to vote and hold office on the board of directors. This membership requires purchase of Stock Holder Bond for \$500.00 to be paid in full. The annual membership is \$1300 plus \$100 assessment, and \$50 scrip at the bar and restaurant. All Bonded members receive access to the USGA handicap computation service, access to the GHIN system to include the GAP App, access to member-play day and special events lotteries, free golf digest, free GAP magazine, and access to compete in GAP events at an additional fee. This membership category will receive special invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

**Junior Membership** (Age 14 - 15 Yrs.) Junior Golf Members enjoy all of the same member benefits as Full Golf Members, excluding voting rights. There is no initiation fee, scrip, or bond. \$250 Yearly Dues. This membership category will receive special invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

**Junior Membership** (16-20 Yrs. or college age through 25 Yrs.) Junior Golf Members enjoy all of the same member benefits as Full Golf Members, excluding voting rights. There is no initiation fee, scrip, or bond. \$350 Yearly Dues. Junior Members must be at least 16 years of age and have a valid automobile driver's license to operate a golf cart. This membership category will receive special invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

**Social Membership** (Class 1) As a social member there is no initiation fee or bond. Annual dues cost \$650 Yearly Dues; \$50 Scrip; \$100 Yearly Assessment; Total \$800. Social Membership (Class 1) is open to any individual over the age of 36. Membership includes limited golf of 5 (five) times per year and the payment of green fees and cart fees as determined by the Board of Directors. This membership category does not have voting rights or stock options and are limited to invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

Young Adult Membership (Ages 21 - 35) (Limited to 5 Years) \* As a Young Adult Golf Member you will enjoy all of the same member benefits as a Full Golf Membership, excluding voting rights. The annual dues cost \$575 Yearly Dues; \$50 Scrip; \$100 Yearly Assessment; Total \$725. Young Adult Members are eligible for full use of the course, club house, and invitation into certain tournaments. Membership includes unlimited golf with no green fees. Young Adult Members are encouraged to bring guests as green fee players. Nonrefundable \$100 yearly payments toward your bond will begin as a Young Adult member. This membership category does not have voting rights or stock options and are limited to invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

Family Member \* A non-equity family member is open to all new members over the age of 21 who is the spouse or life partner of a voting member. The annual dues cost \$575 Yearly Dues; \$50 Scrip; \$100 Yearly Assessment.. Total \$725. Non-Equity Family Members are eligible for full use of the course, club house, and tournaments. Membership includes unlimited golf with no green fees. Non-Equity Family Members are encouraged to bring guests as green fee players. This membership category does not have voting rights or stock options and are limited for invitations to Honesdale Golf Club Tournaments.

**Second Club Membership** \* A non-equity second club member is open to all members. There is no initiation fee or bond. Annual dues. No initiation fee or bond. \$675 Yearly Dues; \$50 Scrip; \$100 Yearly Assessment. Total \$825. This membership is open to members of another golf club only. Full use of the grounds, club house, invitation to all tournaments, unlimited golf, no green fees, and bring guests as green fee players.


#### **Please Note:**

## Women Have Been Teeing Off For Quite Some Time

Since March was National Women's History Month, it seemed very fitting to start our history column with mention to the importance of women during the founding vears of the Honesdale Golf Club.

Women have a long history with golf that dates back to the 1500's in Scotland. However it wasn't until the late 1800's that the United States welcomed women players. It is believed that the first to do so was Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southhampton, New York in 1891.

As championship our

board shows, Honesdale Golf Club is also one of the earliest clubs to welcome women players. Rebecca Fuller was the first woman champion at HGC in 1901!

Unfortunately the HGC minutes of the first five years have been lost, but the 1906 records show that women outnumbered men. There were 186 total members, which 106 were women and 80 were men! Women had equal club voting rights and were elected to the Board Governors (directors) and were often elected Vice President.

It is also noted that women

were in the majority for the first forty years at HGC. That didn't change until the mid 1940's. Possible cause for this was due to World War II.

It is absolutely amazing that our small, rural golf club was far ahead of the times and opened the way for women to play golf.

Please take a moment and notice the women's championship board in the bar/restaurant area.

On a national level, the LPGA was established in 1950 by thirteen brave and bold women launching a dream for women to play professional golf. Over the years there have been outstanding women golfers and today's professional women golfers are no exception.

first professional The female golfer was Helen Hicks in 1934. In the 1940's-50's Babe Zaharias was a legendary golfer who was the first female to professionally compete against men. In modern day, Annika Sörenstam has been called the best female golfer of all time.
